
A girl of our age played a melody on the violin.

After the ballets we are the Polish lesson in which we learned some words of this language, for example:


Hello: Dzień dobry - Enjoy your meal: Smacznego

After having assembled and filled our work with wax, while it solidified, we


witnessed the lighting of a bonfire to which we were invited.

After visiting the museum, we visited the gingerbread house, where after smelling the products, we made a personalized cinnamon biscuit.


Later, while we waited for the cake to be cooked, we took a look at a small shop where there were some handmade souvenirs.
