- as teachers when we use apps we must be sure that they are age-appropriate and accessible to our students and that the data created is saved on protected servers








- G-Suite offers various Google applications:

- Free version for videos up to 15 minutes long








Bookcreator

 allows you to create quizzes, match ups, word games and much more








Padlet
